Preludes by JS Bach's cousin Johann Gottfried Walther. Afterwards, the Chorale=Improvisation on 'Wachet auf' by Sigfried Karg-Elert (1877-1933); by turns joyful, stormy and contemplative, the ending is – unexpectedly – quiet and subdued in anticipation of the bridegroom's arrival. Today's anthem is 'Advent Message' by English organist-composer Martin How. Our Gradual hymn is a metrical version of Ps 122, per the Lectionary readings for Advent 1.
